Following is a curriculum overview i.e. what will be taught in the year 3 class during this term:

<u>Literacy:</u>

During the first part of the half term pupils will be studying a traditional tale with a twist i.e. The true story of the three little pigs. They will working to develop the plot from a different point of view and how that can change the whole outlook and the outcome of the story. They will apply the skills acquired to change a different traditional tale.

Next pupils will be looking at the features of narrative writing about a tragedy and how it effected everyone involved. They will be writing an ending for the story including adjectives, adverbs and varied conjunctions.

Numeracy

During this term pupils will be revising times tables and looking at being able to tell the time.

Children will also be studying fractions, solving problems using their knowledge of fractions.

<u>ALL</u> children need to work on developing their knowledge of 2,3,4,5,8 and 10 time tables and be able to use these to work out related division facts.

Topic:

In the first part of the term pupils will study why muscles and bones are essential and help us to move. They will be studying what we need to do to stay healthy including the need to eat healthy and exercise.

Next, children will be studying the deigns of Coco Chanel and Cath Kidston and creating framed fabric montages based on their design styles. This will include sewing, making bows, printing and mounting into a constructed wooden frame.

Computing:

Pupils will use Scratch to create their own programs featuring sequences. The final project is to write the code for moving a sprite in four directions (up, down, left and right). They will then explore movement within the context of a maze, using appropriately sized sprite.

Moral and Social:

Continue work on our social action objective and then work to create a more nature friendly garden space. Pupils will be clearing up space, refreshing and replenishing the bug hotels and constructing pinecone bird feeders.
